

- c. Lost library books has to be replaced by the borrower or a fine will be charged. (Double of the Cost)
- d. Students are not allowed to bring their own books in the library.
- e. In case of any damage to the library books, disciplinary action will be taken.
- f. Reference Books are not issued to the students.
- g. Students are supposed to keep silence in the library.

### COLLEGE MAGAZINE

College magazine “IQRA” is published annually under the supervision of senior professors with English, Urdu and Punjabi sections to explore literary potentials of the students through their wrings.

### PROCTORIAL BOARD

Proctorial Board is responsible for maintaining law and order situation in the college premises and reserves the right to punish any student involved in misconduct.

### BULLETIN

A college bulletin is published regularly to keep the students informed of all notices/orders, and progress related to College affairs. Any notice published in bulletin is considered to be communicated to all the students.

### DISPENSARY

A well equipped dispensary is available for first-aid in case of emergency. An M.B.B.S doctor visits the college periodically for consultation.

### **RESEARCH LABS**

The use of innovative applied research to solve real-world problems is one of M.A.O's main areas of focus.

### **I.T. LABS**

The computer lab serves as the center for teaching the use of computer to the students, usually by a specialist computer teacher. Teachers also use the lab with their classes for research, or for creating technology-based projects.

### **MODEL CLASS ROOMS**

College has developed model class rooms equipped with multimedia projectors for each BS (Hons.) Program.

### **GUIDANCE AND COUNSELING CENTRE**

Guidance and counseling is the process which helps the students to know their skills, interests, personality that will help students in further career selection.

### **SPORTS FACILITIES**

These facilities have played a very important role in promoting physical and mental health of the students.

### **CANTEEN**

Fresh hygienic food is available at subsidized rates for students, teachers and staff.

### **FILTRATION PLANT**

Drinking water treatment plants provide pure, safe and reliable drinking water to the students, teachers and staff.

### **PARENT TEACHER MEETING (PTM)**

A relationship of trust between parents and teachers is considered essential for the academic evolution of the students. A number of formal parent-teacher meetings are held during academic session. The college provides an effective platform where parents and teachers can discuss the conduct, behavior and above all attendance and academic result of the students.

### **CLEAN & GREEN M.A.O.**

"Going green" means to pursue knowledge and practices that can lead to more environmentally friendly and ecologically responsible decisions and lifestyles, which can help protect the environment and sustain its natural resources for current and future generations.

### **MOTORCYCLE STAND**

In the college premises, specific area has been allocated for Motorcycle Stand. Although Security guards are there, it is advised to the students and workers to keep their vehicles properly locked. College Administration would not be responsible for any theft or damage.

## SECURITY SYSTEM

Walk through gate, metal detector, CCTV cameras and armed security guards are working for the safety of students under the supervision of chief security in-charge.

## TRANSPORT FACILITY

Transport facility is available for the students on specific routes. Students will have to pay for this transport facility. The transport office generally issues passes for the New Academic Year from the beginning of an academic session.

## General Rules for Admission in BS (Hons.) 4 Years Degree Programs

- i. Only those candidates who have passed their Higher Secondary School Certificate Examination in the 1st annual 2025 OR in the 2nd annual 2024 will be eligible to apply for admission.
- ii. Maximum Age limit is 24 years extendable upto 26 years for fresh candidates of annual 2025. No age limit for Evening Shift.
- iii. Admission is granted strictly on merit.
- iv. College Authorities can reject a candidate's application for admission on the ground of unbecoming character or conduct.
- v. College Authorities have the right to cancel the admission of a candidate, at any stage after the admission, when it comes to their knowledge that the documents presented by him/her are fake or there is a misstatement or an error in the documents which may affect his/her merit.
- vi. The candidate who remains absent or fails in the interview will not be eligible for admission.
- vii. After the completion of all formalities pertaining to admission, the final list of the selected candidates shall be displayed on the college notice board.
- viii. The candidates who fail to deposit their dues with in due date will forfeit their right to admission.
  - x. In case of board other than Lahore, an original No Objection Certificate (NOC) is required.

**QUOTA:** 2% of total seats are reserved for disabled candidates. The Disabled candidates shall attach with their admission forms the "Disability Certificate" obtained from District Disability Board or the District Assessing Board. The candidate must write "Special Candidate" in the space provided at the top of the admission forms. The Candidates will have to appear before the Medical Officer appointed for this purpose by College Authorities.

## 2- BS 5th Semester Program (Replacement of MA/MSc)

The candidates holding B.A/B.Sc. / Associate Degree Arts/Commerce/Science (14-Years of Education) or equivalent qualification and not more than 26 years of age shall be eligible for admission in BS 5th Semester or equivalent programs. 2% marks will be deducted for each late session to a maximum of previous five sessions/years. Such applicant has to furnish an affidavit to the effect that he/she did not get admission in any Institution in the period between the year of passing the Examination and year of application for admission. (vide notification No. S.O (C.A) 1-28/2025 dated 20th July, 2016).

# GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

## 1. College Uniform

The basic purpose of wearing uniform is that the students should have a district identity. The college has prescribed the following uniforms for Intermediate and BS (Hons.) students.

- (4) Black Shoes (5) Grey Blazer/Sweater (for winter Only).

#### b) Evening Shift (Boys)

- (1) White Shirt (2) Khaki Trousers (3) Uniform Neck Tie (Blue & Grey Strips)
- (4) Black Shoes (5) Green Blazer/Sweater (for winter Only).

#### c) Morning Shift (Girls)

- (1) White Shalwar Qameez ( from 1st to 8th Semester)
- (2) Pink Dupata (from 1st to 4th Semester)
- (3) Blue Dupata (from 5th to 8th Semester)
- (4) Grey Blazer/Black Shawl (for winter only)

#### d) Evening Shift (Girls)

- (2) Green Dupata (from 1st to 8th Semester)

## 2. College Identity Card

- i. It is compulsory for every student to obtain his/her identity card from the college Registrar office immediately after his/her admission.
- ii. If an identity card is lost, a new one will be issued after a fine of Rs. 100/-.
- iii. Student's Identity Card is the property of the College. It is compulsory for every student to hand over his identity card to the College office for record, if he is dropped from the college rolls, or leaves the College or at the termination of the College session.

### 3. College Timings

a) **Morning Timings:** 08:00 a.m. to 02:00 p.m.

b) **Evening Timings:** 01:00 p.m. to 05:00 p.m.

Note: Students of morning and evening shift will have to observe the above official time strictly.

### 4. Attendance

- i. The minimum attendance percentage in each subject to qualify to appear for the final examination is 75% as per Punjab University Rules and Regulations.
- ii. In case a student leaves the college without approval of sanctioning/concerned authority and if his/her attendance falls below 50% in a month, he/she will be dropped from the College Rolls and his/her status will be notified and communication to the parents.
- iii. The name of the student will be dropped from the college rolls if he remains absent without intimation for 07 days in a month.
- iv. A student whose name has been dropped from the College rolls may be allowed readmission only once.
- v. The readmission fee is Rs. 500/-. (Subject to the grant of readmission by the principal).
- vi. The fine for remaining absent for one period is Rs.5/- and for a full day is Rs.10/-.
- vii. The fine for remaining absent from practical class is Rs. 10/-per class.
- viii. As per University rules 75% of the total number of lectures delivered in each subject are compulsory to attend for a student otherwise the admission will be with held.
- ix. Principal reserves the right to expel a student from college on account of misconduct/failure to pull up academically.

### 5. Leave Rules

- i. Leave will be granted only in case of extreme urgency subject to the permission of the concerned HOD and the Registrar Office.
- ii. Leave application has to be submitted and got sanctioned before hand.
- iii. Sick leave should be accompanied with a proper Medical Certificate.
- iv. Prescribed Leave Application Forms are available in the College Office.
- v. The Leave Application should reach the Registrar Office on the prescribed Proforma. This application must be countersigned by the father/guardian.

### 6. Fee / Dues

A student's name will be dropped from the college rolls if he/she does not pay the dues. Readmission is allowed only on the recommendation of Admission Committee and approval by the Principal. (Detail of College Fee / Dues is given at the end)

#### **Fee Concession:**

Fee concession and stipends for deserving students are granted on the recommendation of Financial Assistance Committee.

- i. Only those poor and needy students who are regular in classes and have a sound academic career are eligible to apply for fee concession.
- ii. Orphans can be accommodated on compassionate grounds, provided they furnish Death Certificate of the deceased parent /guardian.
- iii. Irregular, absentee and failing students in House Examination will forfeit their right of fee concession.
- iv. Application for fee concession or any kind of financial assistance will be verified by the parents.

### 7. Disciplinary Rules

A Disciplinary Committee is empowered to assess the standards and disciplinary action on the misconduct of students. It is authorised to constitute the disciplinary measures for the students. A student is bound to obey/abide by the college rules or any notification/order issued by the Principal's Office / Registrar Office during the session:

- i. No student is allowed to take part in any kind of political/unethical activity.
- ii. Smoking/Keeping any kind of drug is not allowed within college premises.
- iii. Student should behave gently within College premises.
- iv. Wall chalking/placing any Kind of poster is strictly prohibited.
- v. Damaging College Property is not allowed. The defaulters will have to pay for the damages.
- vi. Every student must hang his/her I.D. Card during College hours.
- vii. No student is allowed to keep any kind of arms (Licensed/Unlicensed) in his/her possession.
- viii. Out-siders are not allowed to enter college premises without the permission of Principal.

## SPECIFIC RULES & REGULATIONS

### BS (Hons.) 4 Years Degree Program

For the smooth running of semester system, college will arrange an orientation program for newly admitted students one day prior to the start of regular classes. Respective Head of Departments (HODs) and Departmental Co-ordinators will deal course related issues of student while exam related information and issues will be addressed by the Controller of Examinations.

The College is affiliated with the University of the Punjab. The Semester Rules and Regulations for BS(Hons.) Program will be obeyed according to the rules and regulations present on the Punjab University website. Some necessary rules and regulation are given below for the knowledge of the students:

#### 1. Duration of Study

The total duration of a BS Program is four years. Each academic year is consisted of two semesters. In case of valid reasons the period of study may be extended for two additional years (i.e., four semesters). The students who do not complete studies within the stated period will have their names struck off from the rolls of the college. The students who have been given the right to extend the duration of study for additional two years must register and pay tuition fee for these years.

#### 2. Semester's Schedule

There will be two semesters in an academic year: Fall Semester and Spring Semester. Each semester will be of 17 working weeks-16 weeks for teaching and one week for mid Semester Examinations. Final Examinations will be conducted by University of the Punjab at the end of each semester. Schedule (date sheet) of final examinations will be issued by Controller of Examinations, University of the Punjab.

#### 3. Credit Hours Requirement

- a. A minimum 124-136 credit hours (see 4 below for definition) are required for the 4-year degree programs. The said credits will normally be earned in eight semesters.
- b. The minimum number of credit hours in course will be governed by the curriculum/syllabi and roadmap provided by University of the Punjab.
- c. A course may range from one credit hours.
- d. One credit hour stands for at least one hour class contact per week per semester. For practical/laboratory work 3 hours will be considered equivalent to one credit hour.
- e. Six (06) credit hours research project (dissertation) / project report/internship/special paper I offered in the fourth year.
- f. Above clauses (a-e) are dictated by the HEC curricula for the relevant degree programs.
- g. A student must have attended at least 75% of the classes held in a course in order to be allowed to sit in the final examination.
- h. In case the student remains absent from the class for seven consecutive days without leave, his/her name will be removed from the rolls.

- I. Students having less than 75% class attendance in a particular course will be required to repeat the course in the same semester next year. Names of such students will be reported by the college to University of the Punjab and these students shall not be allowed to appear in the final examinations.

#### 4. Evaluation Criteria

Students will be evaluated on the basis of two examinations, called Mid Semester Examination and Final Examination, homework, quizzes, assignments, presentations, etc. This evaluation criteria and their percentage weight of grade are given below:

- The course teacher is responsible for the evaluation of work/performance of the students of his class and for the award of grades to them on the basis of aforementioned evaluation criterion.
- The number and nature of tests and assignments depend on the nature of the course. To pass a course, a student must obtain 50% marks (i.e., 'D' grade) cumulative in Mid Semester Examination, Sessional Work, and Final Examination.
- There will be no choice in questions in the mid semester and final examination papers.
- The scripts of each activity, i.e., mid semester examination, homework, quiz etc. will be shown to the students by the concerned teachers within one week, taken back immediately in accordance with the announced schedule along with the examination schedule.
- In case a student is not satisfied with his/her award even after checking his/her answer book, or clarification from the teacher, he/she may make written complaint to chairman/Principal within two weeks of at the end of mid semester examinations week. The Chairman/Principal will refer his/her case to the Examination Committee of the Department/College.
- The mid semester examinations will be conducted after eight weeks of the commencement of the semester. The final examination will be conducted according to the schedule (i.e., date sheet) announced by University of the Punjab.
- The duration of the examinations will be as follows:

#### 5. Grading System

The Final term examination (60 marks) pattern of Punjab University is:

- Letter grading should only be used for representing the individual courses and not for semester GPA or CGPA.
- Equivalence in numerical grades, letter grades and grade points is as under:
- Maximum possible Grade Point Average is 4.00
- Minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average for obtaining a 4-year BS Degree is 2.00.

e. Calculation of Grade Point Average (GPA) for a Semester:

In order to calculate the GPA, multiply Grade Point with the Credit Hours in each Course to obtain total grade points, add up to cumulative Grade Points and divide by the total number of Credit Hours to get the GPA for the Semester.

## 6. Calculation of Semester Grade Point Average

Calculation of cumulative grade point average will only be made when a candidate has passed all the courses required for the award of degree.

## 7. Rules for Promotion

- A student must obtain a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 2.00 at the end of each semester for promotion to the next semester.
- In case a student is able to obtain GPA of 1.70 or more but less than 2.00 except first semester where GPA of 1.50 or more but less than 2.0, he/she will be promoted to the next Semester on probation (1st probation). If the student does not achieve the desired CGPA of 2.0 but obtains CGPA greater than or equal to 1.7, will go to 2nd (last) probation, The candidate, who fails to secure 1.50 GPA in the first semester or 1.70 CGPA in a subsequent semester, will stand automatically dropped from the rolls of the college.
- A student will have the right to avail probation twice in the following semesters.
- A student has to obtain CGPA 2.00 in the last semester of each program for the award of the degree.
- In the third, fifth, and seventh semesters (where there is applicable) a student is required to repeat the courses of the same semesters respectively in case of his/her failure in the aforementioned semesters.
- In the fourth, sixth and eighth (where there is applicable) a student is required to repeat the courses of the same semesters respectively in case of his/her failure in the aforementioned semesters.
- If a student gets a "D" grade, he/she can repeat the course when offered to improve his/her grade.
- A student, who completes all the courses and has not been required to repeat any course (s), obtains CGPA less than 2.00 but not less than 1.90 at the end of the 8th semester may be allowed to repeat 12 credit hour courses in which he/she had obtained the lowest grades, in order to improve the CGPA so as to obtain the minimum of 2.00 CGPA failing which he/she shall not be awarded degree and removed from the rolls of the College.

- I. In case a student repeats the courses (s) for the improvement of grades which he/she has already taken, the best of the two grades of the course (s) will be considered for CGPA calculations.

## 8. Probation

The promotion of a student on probation will be allowed twice in all the degree programs. If a student in the first semester obtains CGPA less than 2.0 and greater than or equal to 1.5, he/she will be considered on probation. In the subsequent semesters (i.e., second semester onwards), the student will be considered on probation if he/she scores CGPA less than 2.0, and greater than or equal to 1.70. In case student does not achieve the minimum desired CGPA of 2.0 in any semester after availing two probatios, he/she will be dropped from the rolls of the College and cannot be re-admitted by the same College under any circumstances.

## 9. Unfair Means Cases

The teacher-in-charge will report unfair means cases in quizzes and mid semester examinations to the Principal who will forward these cases to College Examination Committee within one week for necessary action as under:

Any candidate detected in giving or receiving assistance, or found guilty of copying from any paper, book or note, or allowing any other candidate to copy his answer book, or using, or attempting to use these or any other unfair means, will be dropped from the program not exceeding two semesters.

UMCs in the final examinations will be handled by the office of the Controller of Examinations, University of the Punjab, as per University rules.

If a student fails in a course, he/she will be provided two chances to pass a course by registering for the course again in the same semester of the subsequent years. If a student fails to pass the course after availing these two chances, he/she will be dropped from the rolls of the College.

## 11. Freezing of a Semester

In case of a valid reason a student may freeze his / her studies maximum for one year (two semesters) subject to the permission of Chairperson/Principal of the concerned Department/College. The student will rejoin the same semester in the following year. However, freezing of 1st semester is not allowed.

## 12. Cancellation of Admission

If a student fails to attend any lecture during the first four weeks of the commencement of the semester as per announced schedule, his/her admission stands cancelled automatically without any notice.

## 13. Re-Mid Exam

If a student fails in the regular mid-semester exam he/she should apply to the respective HODs for a re-sit in mid-semester exam which can be held within the completion of the regular semester and an intimation in this regard should be sent to the controller examination of the college immediately without any delay.

## 14. How to Exit

Students who have completed / passed a minimum of 2 years/4 semesters of studies can apply to seek an Exit on medical/emergency grounds. College Administration will decide upon these applications.


